VEGETATION MANAGEMENT

In an effort to reduce tree-related power outages, increase system reliability and reduce customer power outages, Alpena Power Company has an aggressive Vegetation Management Program. Our goal is to clear approximately 20% of our power lines each year. This trimming cycle ensures that all lines on our system are cleared of potentially troublesome trees over each 5 year period.

When trimming distribution lines, our policy is to trim to 15' on either side of the line. When trimming transmission lines we trim 25'-50' on either side of the line depending on the line voltage. We contract tree trimming professionals. If you are not sure who is on your property trimming trees, please ask to see identification.

STORM CLEAN UP

During and after storms, our crews work to trim and/or remove any tree that is interfering with power restoration. It is the property owner's responsibility to clean up trees or debris left on their property following emergency tree trimming or removal.

STORM PREPAREDNESS

- Emergency preparedness kits should include flashlights, batteries, cash, first aid supplies and cell phone charging devices that are fully charged.
- Know where the manual release for electric garage door openers is located and how to use it.
- Keep your car's gas tank full, gas stations rely on electricity to power their pumps.
- If you rely on anything that is power dependent like a medical device determine a back-up plan.
- Keep refrigerators and freezers closed; food can stay cold for approximately 4 hours in a fridge or 24 hours in a freezer.
- Stay away from downed power lines.

PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS AND ASSISTANCE

We encourage anyone who is having difficulty paying their power bill to contact Alpena Power Company's collection department at 989-358-4900. We will gladly work with customers to make satisfactory payment arrangements. 2-1-1 is a free service for Northeast Michigan residents. It operates 24 hours a day and provides callers with information about state and local agencies who have energy assistance programs available, as well as programs for many other needs.



APC offers an Income Assistance Service Provision credit to residential customers whose total household income does not exceed 150% of the Federal Poverty level. If qualified, customers will receive a \$5.00 credit per month for 12 months and must re-certify annually. Customers who receive assistance from a MEAP program, receive a home heating credit energy draft, or qualify for State Emergency Relief (SER) are automatically enrolled. Customers who haven't received assistance, but receive Medicaid or the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) can request a low-income verification form to see if they qualify.



ENERGY SAVINGS INFORMATION

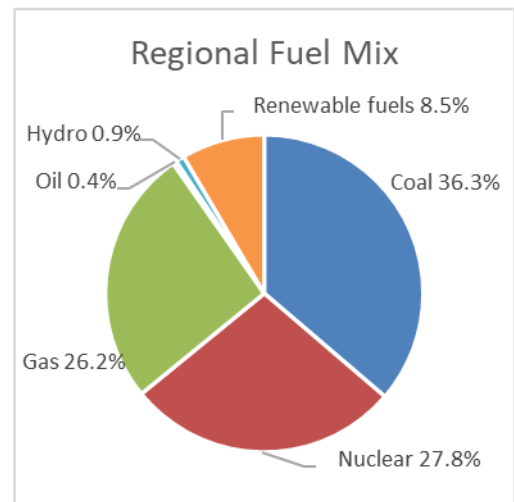
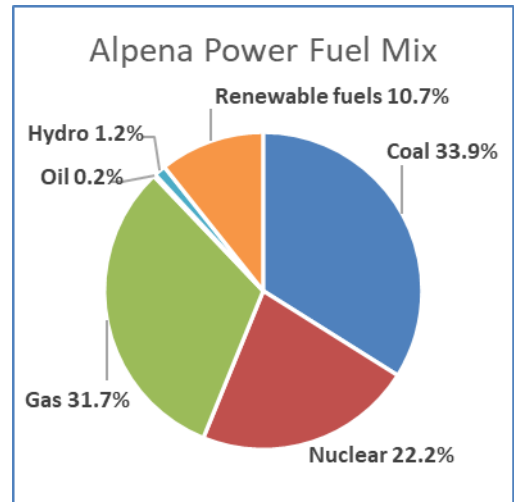
- Some of the biggest energy users in today's homes are: window and central air conditioning units, electric heat, dehumidifiers, sump pumps, well pumps, electric hot water heaters and electric clothes dryers. Be aware of any issues with these devices and get them repaired or replaced. Running out of hot water to quick, check the hot water heater temperature and make sure it is working properly. Dripping faucets make well pumps run more, hot water drips cause electric hot water heaters to run more.
